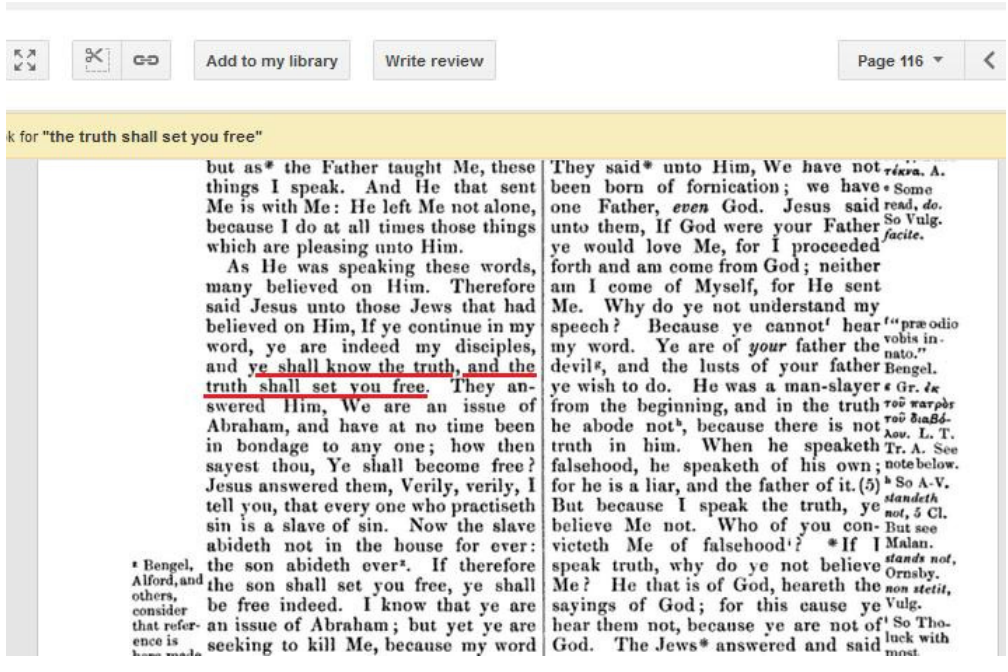

The first of these may, not altogether unreasonably, take a personal form. In scarcely one instance has a variation from the Authorized Version—however apparently slight or unimportant—been made on his own authority. It is impossible to enumerate all the sources from which his information has been derived; but the reader will see, from what has been already said, as well as from his observation during the perusal of the work, that nothing can be further from the writer's wish than to set up his opinion as a competent authority on matters of pure criticism. The present version is conducted upon a plan which differs, in some respects, from others: it is hoped that it may, on this ground, prove not unacceptable to the less advanced class of students; and that it may, perhaps, tend to excite in their minds an interest in the subject, which may lead them hereafter to consult, with certain profit to themselves, the works of Dean Alford, Mr. Highton, and other eminent scholars.



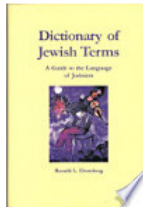
The verse today reads in part: "[Isaiah 11:6](#) The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb"

In a passage read today in synagogues as the *haftarah* on Yom Kippur morning (57:14-58:14), Isaiah railed against those who piously fast and then oppress their neighbors, arguing that God is more interested in social justice for the weak and the poor than in the offering of sacrifices in the Temple. 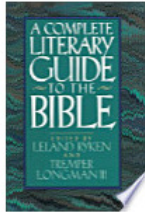

In chapter 2 the pattern continues in implicit contrast to chapter 1. Instead of leading a military campaign, they will come in peace, beating their swords into plowshares and spears into pruning hooks (v. 4). Whereas in 1:10 the word of God was addressed to rebellious Israelites, here Gentiles seek to obey it (2:2–4). The rest of the chapter works on a series of antitheses respecting the debasement of human pride and the elevation of God's power (see, e.g., vv. 11, 20–22). Grogan goes into more detail on this pattern in both chapters (28–39). Not inappropriately, therefore, the New Open Bible refers to Isaiah as “the Shakespeare of the prophets” (770).

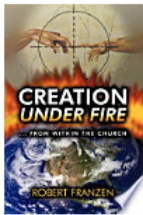
